DENTAL CLINIC

The Dental Clinic offers dental examinations and cleaning by students in the Dental Assisting and Dental Hygiene programs, under the supervision of teaching staff and dentists. There is a \$35 fee for adults, \$10 for children (12-years-old and under), and \$25 ages 13-16, which covers all appointments and services required for complete care. Students who have not opted out of the mandatory Student Health Insurance Plan, can complete a form to be reimbursed the percentage allowable through the Student Health Plan of the \$35 fee.

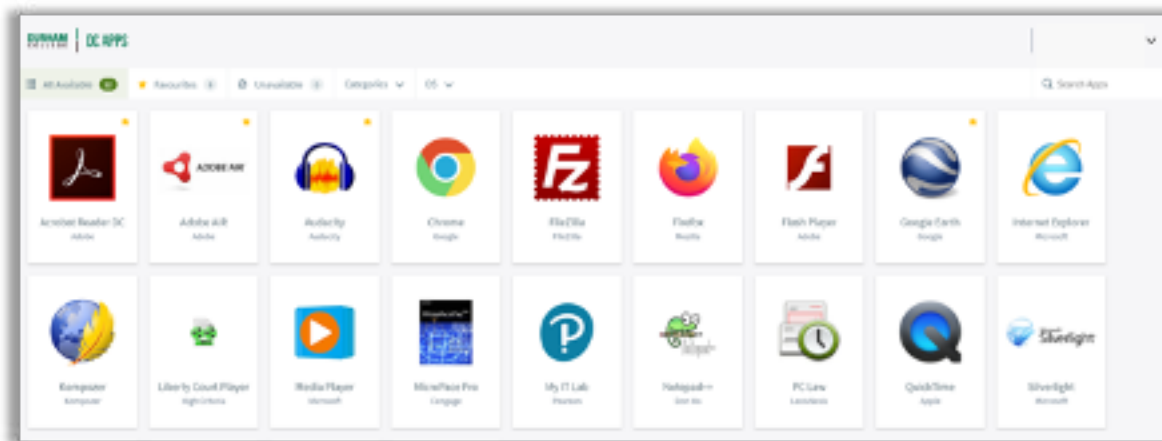
Remote access to Lab Software

AppsAnywhere

Students will now have access to most DC lab software through DCApps.

DCApps is a new web-based app hub, powered by AppsAnywhere, that will allow you to run program-specific software using any Windows computer from anywhere.

The web-based tool – AppsAnywhere is displayed as a “App store-style” portal interface. When accessed, you will be able to run software in the labs, to which you are authorized, on your personal Windows computer.



Below are instructions to access DCApps (effective September 4, 2020):

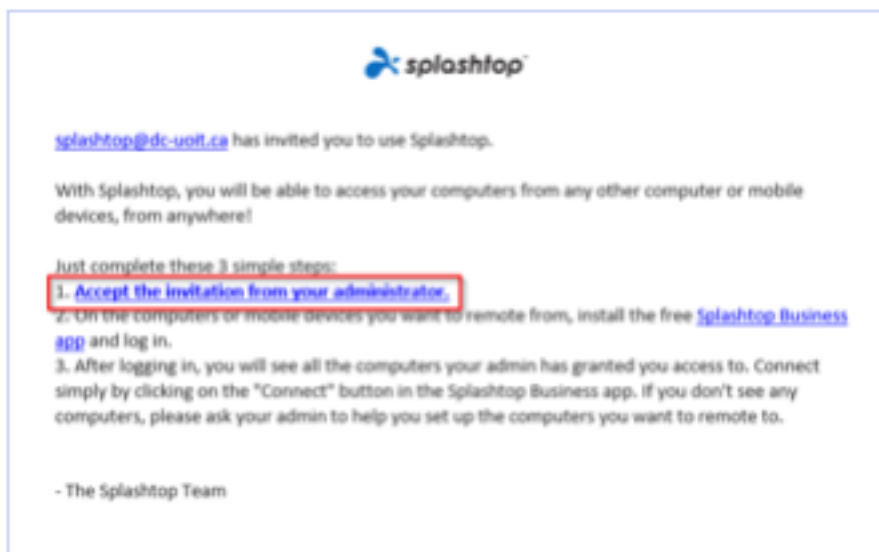
1. Log on to <https://dcapps.durhamcollege.ca/> using your network ID and password on any Windows 10 enabled computer.
2. Once your DCApps session has been automatically validated, you'll have access to a variety of applications, based on your program of study. Note, the first time you launch DCApps on your computer, you may be asked to install the AppsAnywhere application.
3. To launch an application, simply click on the icon.
4. Once the application has been successfully installed, the application will launch automatically. Applications can easily be uninstalled at any time

Splashtop

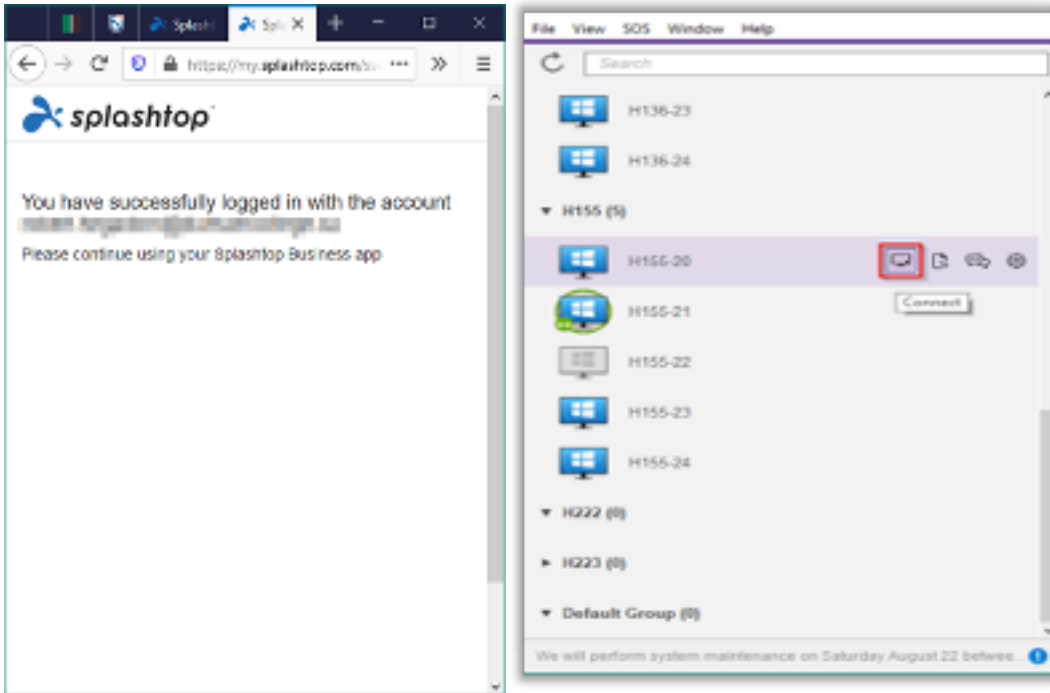
ITS has also installed an approach to facilitate students access to computers in specialized labs on campus with more powerful machines and complex software.

To facilitate this, a computer connectivity tool – Splashtop has been installed. Authorized students from specific courses will be given access and allowed to connect remotely from anywhere using their personal device(s). Students authorized to utilize this approach for their course(s) will be informed by their instructors and provided instructions during the start of classes.

To initiate the Splashtop install, students will receive an email welcoming them to the Splashtop product when they are added to the system. Installation starts when you click on a link in the email to: " Accept the invitation from your Administrator".



When the install is complete your web browser will display a successful login notice.



The Splashtop Business App should now display all of the Splashtop remotely-accessible computers to which you have been granted access, organized by room.

Instructors will provide instructions to students approved for this access during classes (effective September 8, 2020).

VPN

The remote access to computers on campus requires students to be able to do this securely. ITS has therefore provisioned access using Virtual Private Network (VPN) for authorized students.

Students approved to connect using VPN will receive detailed instructions during initial classes of the semester.

These detailed instructions will outline how to download, install and connect to the Global Protect Student VPN used by Durham College and Ontario Tech University. Details will include how to download and install the software, and how to connect to the VPN.

You will Download and Install the correct version of Global Protect for your device: Windows or Apple computer. Ensure you select the correct one for your device.

To initialize this install, authorized students will go to <https://svpn.dc-ot.ca2>. Sign in with your network ID and password.

PRINTING (NOTE CHANGES TO PRINT CREDITS PROCESS)

Pay-as-you-go (Papercut)

To print, while on campus, students access the print portal Papercut , (campusprinting.dc-uoit.ca) and apply credits to manage print jobs.

Returning students should note that changes have been made to the print credits process and printing on-campus will now function on a “pay as you go” service for which you are responsible.

Students will be able to purchase ‘ print packs’ from College and University bookstores to top up their cards as they wish. It is recommended that credits be purchased ideally a day in advance to allow for the processing of updates.

The changes follow a reduction in ancillary fees paid by students. As printing charges are no longer included in these fees, this allows you full management of your printing. This means that the \$23.00 print credits that were applied in the past on student cards at the start of the academic year will no longer occur. Ancillary fees will continue to cover other facets of technology services including your use of DC Connect, MyCampus and DCApps (a new portal allowing students to access many software titles in computer labs remotely).

Students can purchase print credits at several locations on campus including the Oshawa Campus Store and the Whitby Campus Bookstore.

If you wish to verify your purchased print credits balance, please visit the campus printing self-service portal at <http://campusprinting.dc-uoit.ca>. To login to the portal use your network username and password, this portal provides many features including a view of print history, and view the print rates for a variety of printers (colour, black and white, double sided etc.) and other print details.

Please note due to the Pay-as-you-go print credit changes credit balances will no longer be reset to \$23.00 on September 1 and any past balances do not carry over

To print while on campus, remember to:

- » Printing on-campus will now function on a “pay as you go” service
- » You are responsible to purchase your own credits at the campus bookstores
- » Purchase credits ideally a day in advance to allow for the processing of updates
- » Print on any printer on campus without adding the printer to your laptop
- » Review your account use and environmental impact
- » View the print rates for a variety of printers (colour, black and white, double sided etc.)

Print rates:

- » Black & White prints - 3 cents per page
- » Coloured prints - 30 cents per page
- » Duplex Printing - 2 cents per page(B&W), 10% discount per page (colour)

PASSWORDS

Network password

Your Network user identification (e.g. 100234567) and password are used for most college computer systems including Wi-Fi, DC Connect, and on-campus computers.

The Self-Service Network Password Management tool allows students (on or off campus) to set up a profile of 'security' questions as an option to reset a network password. These security questions are to be set up prior to the tool being used as they are tied to your network password at the time of enrollment. Once you have set up your profile you will be able to:

- » Change your password
- » Reset your password
- » Unlock your account
- » Edit your password profile

MyCampus password

MyCampus is the central hub for information regarding academic, administrative and extracurricular college events. Your MyCampus username is your student identification number (e.g. 1002343567) and the initial password is your date of birth in the format MMDDYY. If you do not have a birth date on file, the password will be your postal code.

If you forgot your password or have a located account, you can reset your MyCampus password with the MyCampus Password Rest Utility.
